#### From the Pastor ....

For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation. He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress;

I shall never be shaken. Psalm 62:1-2

Dear Friends in Christ,

We are now in the thick of winter. The temperatures have plummeted, the winds have come, and it has snowed. At the time of this writing, we just experienced a weekend full of strong winds and just the other day we received several inches of snow. What is it like for you when the storms come? When the winds blow and the temperature is frigidly cold? Truth be told, we know what it is like to bundle up and confront the weather when it is time to get the shovels and snow blowers out to remove the snow. But, each of us has experienced and weathered winds and storms in our lives through loss, grief, change, trials, conflict, hardships, doubts, and so much more. Take time to reflect on the storms that you have encountered. During those times, how did you weather the storm? What did you learn? How did you continue to move forward?

About six years ago, a massive wind storm came through the area where we were living. Through the storm, several trees could not withstand the wind and they fell down to the ground. Thankfully, the trees fell away from the house. I remember looking out of the kitchen window and seeing the massive roots of the tree facing me. It was a disconcerting sight to see. It was a truly a frightful sight to see. Through experiencing and seeing this, I began to wonder about rootedness and what it means to be rooted. Likewise, when we are rooted and steadfast, we can be unshakeable. And, that is what we are being called to do...to be unshakeable.

There will be storms we experience where we might feel overwhelmed, rattled, and flustered; there will be times where we might be pruned. Despite that, we are still able to grow, blossom, and flourish if we are deeply grounded and rooted because we are unshakeable.

Right now, we are in the middle of a sermon series as we look at a faith statement that was drafted by a team of people from the church to reflect our core beliefs. These core beliefs are the bedrock to our faith. They affirm who God is and who we are as sons and daughters of God and as the church together. In each of our lives, we have experienced much transition over the past several years, and, as such, it is important for us to dive deep into the core of our faith,

#### February Mission of the Month

Agape Family Shelter, submitted by Kathy Snavely, Champion

God creates miracles at Agape Family Shelter every day! Here are the stories of two women and their families, and how your prayers and financial support enable their growth and stability.

Michelle, 54, came to Agape Family Shelter after losing her job and home due to health issues. She had recently found a new job at a doctor's office, but did not have the resources for a deposit on an apartment. After a few months at Agape, however, Michelle

had saved a large enough nest egg to find a place of her own. She made some supportive new friends at work and felt ready to live independently again. Michelle moved out of Agape in November to live in her own new apartment. Ashley, 23, came to Agape Family Shelter six months pregnant and with a 3-year-old son. She had no support from her family, no

savings, and had lost both her job and the apartment she struggled to rent after her relationship with her son's father ended. Ashley was depressed and struggling with her responsibilities as a parent. She needed

stability, a fresh start - and time to work on her parenting and housekeeping skills. After several months at Agape, Ashley found a job and started to build her savings. She gave birth to a second son and had a safe home to which to bring him.

Ashley moved from the shelter in December with a job, two happy, healthy children and enough money to start a new life.

Please continue to pray for these two families. Thank you for your commitment to creating an environment with the support where these families can thrive – in Jesus' name!!

#### From Finance....

We have a new General Fund budget for 2024. Note that the General Fund budget does not include special mission giving. Usually we talk about numbers so here they are:

Projected Income for 2023: \$398,724 Actual Income for 2023: \$386,317 Projected Expenses for 2023: \$394,436 Actual Expenses for 2023: \$362,139 Projected Income for 2024: \$402,017 Projected Expenses for 2024: \$395,224

Here is how the expected income for 2024 breaks down:

Giving: \$354,817 Fund Raisers: \$5,700

Interest: \$41,500 Interest income continues to grow. In 2023, our interest income was \$33,418.

Next month I will place a graph/chart in the Caller to show the breakdown of expected expenses for each of our major areas of ministry.

Hope you have picked up your 2023 monthly giving statements and remember, if you have not yet submitted a General Fund pledge card for 2024, it is never too late to do so.



## Preserving the Past, Preparing for the Future

Building & Grounds Improvements Campaign DECEMBER 2023---FINAL UPDATE

December 31<sup>st</sup> marked the end of our CUMC Capital Campaign. Thank you so much to everyone for your time, contributions and prayers as we worked to "Preserve the Past and Prepare for the Future". I'd also like to take a minute to remember someone who helped to launch this campaign and provided me and the group with a lot of guidance. Thank you to Bob Ladd; we know you're with us in spirit to celebrate this great journey.

We close out the campaign with \$295,948 of the \$300,000 goal. I feel this is a success given that we have altered some projects to come in under the initial budget and didn't spend the campaign fundraising fees that were budgeted. With all of the hard work by Trustees there is \$46,992 left over for capital projects after repayment to the Long Term Repair Fund.

Thank you all for everything you've done. We're planning a celebration ceremony Sunday, February 18 with some small refreshments after the service. Please mark your calendars and we look forward to you joining us.
