

In a simple act of turning on the news, we are reminded over and over again that we live in a world that continues to live in darkness.



December Mission of the Month

Greg & Anita Giagnocavo, Hands of Hope

How We Started

In 1998 our family Greg & Anita Giagnocavo and our four children moved from Pennsylvania to Guatemala. We started the Hands of Hope Ministry Mission (which is Manos de Esperanza, in Spanish) operating a mobile medical clinic to the rural poor in Guatemala.



We are a Christian, faith-based mission and we rely on donations from others to fund the needs of the clinic. However, we serve everyone equally without regard to their particular religious beliefs or non-belief. Hands of Hope is



a registered USA 501(c)3 non-profit and all donations in the USA and Canada are tax-deductible.

What We Do

Our mission and goal is to serve the very poor rural indigenous people while demonstrating the love of Jesus. Our 2,400 square foot permanent

medical clinic is located in the mountains about 45 minutes from the town of Antiqua, south of Chimaltenango. The nearest town Sumpango. The medical clinic provides healthcare to approximately 10,000 people. It also provides community care such as bed, blanket and housing projects, basic health student sponsorships, teaching. nutrition programs, emotional care groups and more.

PROJECTS COMPLETED: Total expended to-date is just under \$249K.


